Apple and Pear Crumble

On Thursday we made apple crumble to follow a set of instructions and produce a procedural text. Junior students enjoyed locating and up-levelling verbs to make our writing about the experience more interesting.

Marley - Today we made apple and pear crumble. First we peeled and cooked the apples and pears. Next we made the crumble with oats, sugar, flour and butter. I can't wait to eat it tonight.

Gus -

Ingredients

4-6 apples and 2 pears

1/2 cup rolled oats

1/2 cup plain flour

1/2 cup caster sugar

1/3-1/2 cup butter



Method

- Peel then chop the fruit.
- Put it in a pot with a splash of water and a spoon of sugar. Cook on high until they are soft.
- Put in the baking dish and leave to cool.
- Measure the oats, flour and sugar into a bowl. Rub in the butter with your fingers until the mixture looks like wet sand.
- It is right if it holds together when you squeeze it.
- Sprinkle it on top of the cooled stewed fruit and bake in the oven at 190°C for around 20 minutes.
- It is ready to eat when the crumble is crispy and golden.
